

Not sure where to go?.... Here's what we recommend.

East Cruiser Loop (5 miles) - This is the quickest and arguably the prettiest ride in the Palisade area. Starting at our shop on 3rd and Main St., we recommend heading east on 3rd which will turn into N. River Rd.

Colterris Winery (64) Rating: A+ Cost: \$15 / 5 wines

1.5 miles down the road (roughly 8 minutes), you will see Colterris Winery on the right hand side. It has a big gated entrance and vineyards lining the road, you can't miss it. At Colterris, you will find award winning wines, and some of the best views in town. Most seating is outside and shaded. This place gets busy, reservations may be required.

Clark & Co's. Distillery (74) Rating: A+ Cost: \$25 / Food & drink

As you leave Colterris Winery, you'll want to continue east on N. River Rd until you cross the river. Once you cross the river, take a right on Hwy 6. About 1 mile down the road, you will see Clark & Co's. Distillery on the right hand side. This place has the best burgers in Palisade; and offers a great alternative to wine. Be sure to sit on the patio that overlooks the river. *Be sure to check out their family orchard across the street during fruit season.

(Locals Tip: A great float is to launch from the Rim Trail, stop at Clark & Co's beach, grab food & a cocktail and continue floating down to Riverbend Park.)

Bookcliff Vineyards (75) Rating: A Cost: \$12 / flight

Continuing down Hwy 6 about 1.1 miles, you will see a sign for Bookcliff Vineyards. The tasting room is on the south side of Hwy 6. This driveway is gravel and can be a hazard for bikes; exercise caution. Bookcliff boasts some of the best views in the Grand Valley and is known for a wide variety of Red & White wine.

Sauvage Spectrum (77) Rating: A+ Cost: \$12 - \$20

As you continue west on Hwy 6, you will see signs for Sauvage Spectrum, it too is on the south side of Hwy 6. This is a fan favorite and comes highly recommended by our staff. Sauvage is known for their *Sparklet* wines and have a variety of Red and Whites. They are also known for their famous frozen Rose "Frose". On a hot summer day, this is the answer. Sauvage is also a great spot to relax as they have outdoor games, live music and food trucks most weekends.

As you leave Sauvage Spectrum, continue west on Hwy 6. Cross the river again and take your first right on Main St. This will take you right back into downtown Palisade and back to our shop. Either drop your bikes off, or continue to the West Cruiser Loop.
